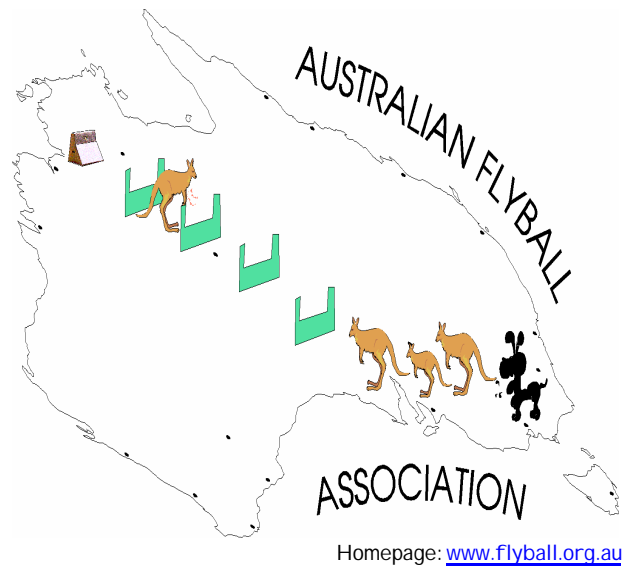

If your club or team are interested in hosting the 2008 AFA Nationals then the AFA Committee are inviting you to forward a submission to the AFA. Closing date for sending in your submission is the 31st March 2007.

AFA Nationals 2009

Expressions of interest are sought from clubs and teams to hold the AFA Nationals in 2009. If your club or team are interested in hosting the 2009 AFA Nationals then the AFA Committee are inviting you to forward a submission to the AFA. Closing date for sending in your submission is the 1st December 2007.

3000 Points Title

At the December Committee Meeting the AFA Committee approved a motion to ballot the financial members of the AFA (not Associate Members) to name the new 3000 point title. There are two options to choose from. The first option is to leave it as it is "3000 point title" or to name it after the first dog that has reached this milestone "Jeddah Award". Jeddah is the little black dog from the Croydon Rockets.

The ballot papers will be mailed out to the members at the beginning of February 2007 and need to be returned to the AFA via mail by the 23rd February 2007. A small General Meeting will be held to confirm the ballot at the Canberra Royal. At this stage we expect that meeting to be at lunch time on Saturday 24th February 2007.

If you don't know of Jeddah the little black dog and her amazing achievements in flyball I have republished the article from the September 2004 Flying Times for you to read.

“You know – Jeddah Trudinger from Croydon & Districts Obedience Dog Club”

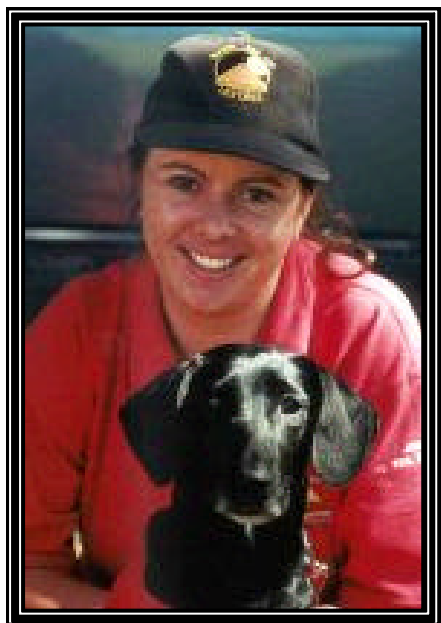


I remember when Jeddah was just starting out and surprised us all (including her mum) by winning the fastest dog competition at the CDC club grounds with the fastest time of the day being run at 4.79 seconds. A huge achievement for those days, we only had about 4 dogs back then that could run anywhere close to under five seconds.

Since then Jeddah has not stopped achieving. With a little help from her friends she has been a part of the Australian National Champion team four times, the Official Australian record holders until recently, Team of the year 4 times and Club of the year 4 times.

On her own her list of achievements are nothing short of staggering.

Jeddah has won Bitch of the Year Twice, she was the first dog in Australia to earn her FMCh (Flyball Master Champion) – 15,000 points and she was also the first dog in Australia to earn her ONYX Award – 20,000 Points.

But now she just takes the cake – Jeddah has again out done herself by being the first dog in Australia to earn her FDGCh (Flyball Dog Grand Champion) – a huge 30,000 title points. Congratulations, Jeddah and Cathy what a milestone, not bad for an eleven year old. (Jeddah I mean not Cathy).

Jeddah just let the AFA know what you would like to call your next title, maybe at 50,000 points we could do a deal.

So as you can see Jeddah has really outdone herself now by being the first dog to get to the new 3000 points title. This is really an amazing achievement for a dog of 14 years old.

The Royal Adelaide Show Flyball Competition – Date to be confirmed.

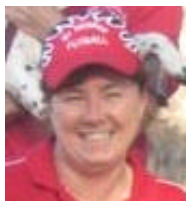
Well done to Dover Gardens Kennel and Obedience Dog Club for putting on some great demonstrations at the Police Expo held back in December.

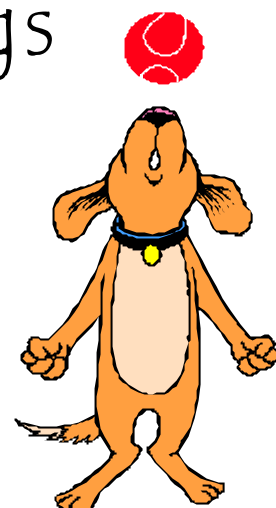

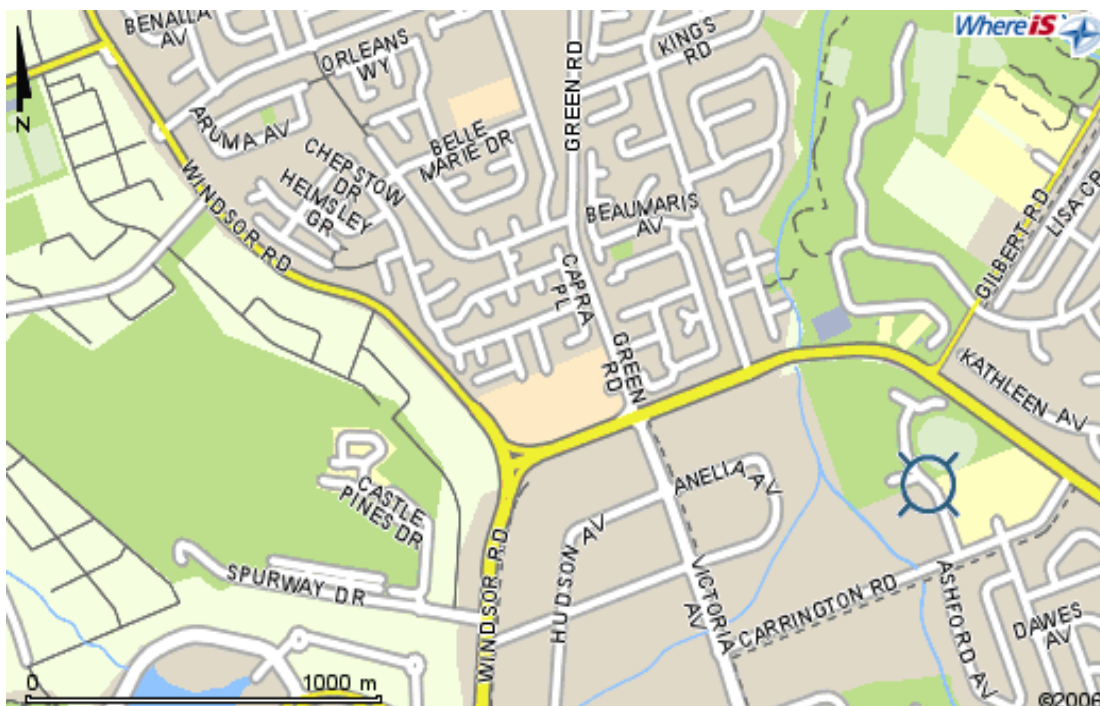
