So club coordinators, it is your duty when approaching a competition early in the new financial year to make sure that all members have renewed their memberships. The new membership card is green.

The **Pro Plan Cup** has come and gone and what a successful cup it was too, congratulations to the winners and commiserations to the rest. I must say that the Victorians are setting the standards here with no less than ten teams usually traveling to interstate competitions and the results were shown in the end when the cheques were handed out in Canberra. Paws for Addisons

Skye Blue had been vomiting for a week. After being on antibiotics for a bacterial disease she was getting worse. Her appetite resided and she found it difficult to walk. When my husband picked her up, she collapsed all four legs splayed out, nose diving our back deck. After an emergency rush to West Chermside Veterinary clinic, a two hour wait and several hundred dollars later (as well as a few years off my life) Skye was diagnosed with Addison's disease. "Addi what", I hear you say, exactly what I said. This article is to make you aware of the basics of Addison's disease. I am no expert on this, as I am still learning new things every week. Skye Blue is my teacher. Skye is 2 years old.

What is Addison's Disease?

Addison's disease is the shutdown and failure of the adrenal glands. At point of diagnosis, it is believed that 85 to 90% of adrenal function has been lost. This causes the insufficient production of adrenal hormones. Since these hormones are essential for life, this is an extremely serious disease.

The adrenal glands produce **Mineralocorticoids** which helps in the control of Sodium and Potassium in the body. Skye Blue's sodium was extremely low and her potassium was extremely high which reduces the heart rate. She only had maybe an hour before her heart would have stopped. The drug **Florinef** helps to stabilise this.

The adrenal glands also produce **Glucocorticoids** which are needed to help K9's adapt to stressful situations. This could include excitement, stress or similar. Without these hormones even the smallest of stress situations can lead to disaster. The drug **Prednisolone** can be given to K9's to provide additional Glucocorticoid in times of stress. Due to this they may drink and pee more, and run a higher body temp than most K9's.

Clinical Signs – What to look for.

Many cases of Addisons's disease go misdiagnosed or not diagnosed, resulting in the loss of many lives. Patients can be any age and could be female or male. (This disease can also occur in cats). At first, signs will be very vague and most patients are treated for something else first.

Some of the following may occur over time: (in Skye's case all of the following)

- Vomiting yellow bile
- Diarrhea with blood
- Lethargy
- Lack of appetite
- Rapid weight loss
- Limping, tremors, weakness in the hindquarters
- Stools covered in mucous
- Hotspots

Treatment after the crisis

Treatment involves the giving of Florinef twice a day. Prednisolone is given when needed. Skye has this before and after agility training. The biggest trick to this is getting the dosages right. Skye was diagnosed on the 16th of January 2003, and we are still playing around with dosages. As she is putting on weight after her 6kg loss, dosage amounts are changing. Each month the K9 has a blood test which determines the sodium and potassium levels. Sodium levels should be between 140 -155. Potassium between 4.0 – 5.4. The ratio (sodium divided by potassium) should be in the low 30's. When levels are stable (three good bloodtests results in a row) tests are only done between 2 - 4 times per year.

Due to initially having gastrointestinal disturbances Skye lost blood. She was diagnosed two weeks ago as anaemic. She gets ½ a multi-vitamin a day and raw liver with her dinner. You have to pay close attention to a K9 with this disease. Any changes in bodily functions or symptoms of sickness could mean a visit to West Chermside for an electrolyte test ASAP. This is why you will find me looking at her gums or feeling her heartbeat half-way through class. Properly maintained Addisonian K9's will appear and feel just as good as any healthy ordinary K9.

Skye Blue attends P.A.D.S on a Monday night. Look out for her, she is a blue and white Border collie who adores everybody. Also watch out for the July/August issue of Dog's Life Magazine which will feature Skye Blue and an article on Addison's Disease. Also, there is some great information and sites through Yahoo! On the internet. I have joined a K9 Addisons group through Yahoo!, which has loads of willing people offering free advice on Addisons as all of us have an AD dog. Please feel free to question, discuss or chat about Skye or this disease with me. As I said I'm no expert but I will try my best to help anyone out. Thanks for your time in reading this article about such an important, life threatening disease. If Skye isn't at training, you'll know she's just having an average off AD dog day.

The AFA committee recently decided to upgrade the sensor beams at the start/finish gates by increasing the number of beams from 4 to 8. Problems arose recently when it was discovered that some small dogs have been able to run under the timing beams and have not triggered them, thus causing the foul light to come on.

The upgrade is being applied to all three sets of the EJS and those who attended the Canberra Frost and Fog Frenzy competition will have noticed the first set of upgraded beams in one ring.

A special thanks goes to David Blow for undertaking the upgrade. David has developed the EJS system used by the AFA and it is as good as any system used worldwide.

The money from the EJS levy, which is applied at every competition, provides funds to enable upgrades and repairs to existing sets and also to provide additional sets as required. With Flyball expanding at the current rate and the probability of two rings for a number of competitions in the future, we will need to provide more EJS sets as the need arises.

My Dog's A Retriever - But He Is Also A Husky

Patches is a piebald Siberian Husky. That is rare enough in itself. However his work ethic and temperament have taken him to titles in six different disciplines - a feat previously unheard of in this breed in Australia. As a pup he was encouraged to chase and bring back a stuffed toy, squeaky rubber critter or ball.

Over time, it became clear that Patches *enjoyed* chasing and returning the ball to us. Then we threw the ball for him outside, first in the enclosed yard, and months later as he grew into adolescence and an easy way of exercising him was needed, taking a tennis racket and hitting a ball up a grassed hill - as far and hard as we could.

One day I read a small official notice in a Canine Journal: the ANKC was recognising Flyball titles. Wouldn't that be something, I thought - imagine a Siberian Husky doing Flyball.

Around that time, we became part of the Mixed Grill team competing in the Centenary of Federation Dog Show which included many aspects of canine sports - obedience, agility, tricks and flyball. I assured them that I would teach Patches the Flyball routine and that he would be (close to) 100% reliable. Maybe not as fast as some other breeds, but reliable - a big plus to my way of thinking. Lateral thinking and clicker training gave me a few ideas to try in the privacy of our quiet home, with no distractions and no grinning spectators.

I borrowed a ball throwing machine and started with cooked pieces of chicken in place of the ball, and encouraged Patches to try to reach them by approaching closer. Sure enough, he stepped on the pad, which caused the food to be hurled at his face - an instant reward, and there was no mistake in his mind as to how he earned it. It took only a few pieces of food before Patches was actively stepping up to the box and hitting the pad. I knew that he had it figured out when I heard Patches triggering the ball thrower whenever he walked past it in the corridor. I had it constantly loaded, so he got the food reward just for trying it out on speculation.

Separately, I taught Patches to go out and return to me over four low jumps. Putting those two actions together was the final step, then practising outside in our fenced yard, and later in open areas with increasing distractions and finally at the competition venue. All done in small steps with much enthusiasm on my part, and juicy treats for Patches after his runs.

Competition day (20 January 2001) dawned too hot (and too soon), but we fronted up to the noise and crowds, ready to do our best. We were lucky enough to have a few practice runs, just as well, as the sight of another dog running in the lane adjacent was a big distraction - Patches veered off to investigate a few

times initially, however, the conditioning and motivators soon got him back on track. He took his turns in our team of four dogs, and ran honestly, if not fast. The team ended up in 2nd place overall, which was a real boost to our confidence.

Patches was also part of a group of different breeds of dogs filmed doing flyball for a television advertisement. This is still screened periodically to publicise upcoming flyball competitions around Canberra.

In early 2003 I practised with the ACT Companion Dog Club teams in the lead up to the Canberra Royal Show where Patches learned to concentrate on doing his runs and to ignore the dog running in the adjacent lane. This was always going to be an issue for him as the Husky's inherited trait of running with a pack (pulling a sled) meant that another dog running close by could distract him.

Richard helped out by being the Box Loader for our team (CDC Express) and his presence at the box end telling Patches to "Touch" the ball and "Go Hup" over the jumps reminded him of what was expected. Both of us being there was reassuring, more so to ourselves than to the dog. Patches took it calmly with none of the barking and jumping that many other dogs do prior to running. He gained 11 Flyball Points at the competition.

As we were in Sydney for breed judging on the day of the Sydney Royal Easter Show Flyball competition anyway, Patches was included in the CDC Scorchers team, which ran in Division 4. In between runs the public crowded around to meet and pat Patches, and many conformation exhibitors wandered through to watch him run, having been told that he was doing Flyball. Our third run that day gave us enough points for that very first Flyball Dog title. What a thrill when Steve Pitt announced over the PA to the spectators that Patches was the first Siberian Husky in Australia with a Flyball title. Our team, the CDC Scorchers, finished Third at that competition.

Warrington Flyball Competition 13th of April 2003, British Flyball Asociation

While we were in England this year we attended a flyball competition run by the Warrington Wires Flyball Team. There were 42 teams competing in 7 divisions, 5 open and 2 starters divisions, June judged one of the starter divisions and Terry did box stewarding in open.

There were 6 teams in each division running a round robin of best of 5 races in open and best of 3 races in the starters divisions

In the starters divisions the teams don't earn title points and there is plastic fencing down both sides of the two racing lanes as well as the usual perimeter fencing. The fences at the box end open out from the last jump and go to the edge of the backboards. At the starting end they open out to just pass the starting posts.

In both open and starters there was a plastic fence that started just behind the judge and ran back down the run off area for about 2/3 of the ring. One other aspect that was different was the positioning of the box steward's position, the steward sat level with the flyball box position.

This gives a better chance to observe the box loader's actions and the dog going for the ball. The types of backboards they use are smaller in width and area covered than our type of backboards.

We found out that there were only two electronic judging systems in the U.K. The one they were using was slightly different to our system. Where we have the starting gates situated so that the start line is between the two rows of sensors, they have the sensors that are triggered by the dog going to the box level with the start line and the rows of sensors are closer together.

On the English lights they have a row of 4 coloured lights for each of the lanes. They are used to indicate if a dog has fouled and which dog it was, if a blue light is lit then dog number 2 has to run again. The system appeared to work well, as each handler knew that if their dog's light was on they had to run their dog again.

There was a separate set of push button switches for each lane, with corresponding coloured buttons to match the fault lights. The timekeepers and line stewards operated these switches, each lane had it's own timer unlike our system where both lanes are timed at the one location. Their system of indicating wins and loses with pegs is the same as ours, the layout of the ring is similar to our rings with the exception of a plastic barrier down the middle of the ring.

The other major difference between AFA & BFA flyball is the maximum jump height, in the BFA

Competitions it is set at 14 inches and not 16 inches as in Australia. They have modified their 8-inch baseboard on the jumps, by making it 7 inches and adding a 1-inch board with foam rubber attached. This is so that if a dog clips the jump the 1-inch board will break; the foam rubber they use for the jumps is the same as the split foam used for hot water pipes.

Most of the boxes we saw were two hole, of the Belgian style and the metal English type box that Croydon had. There were a couple of Canadian boxes there as well, they looked like our old wooden boxes, but had a self cocking mechanism that was mounted parallel to the ground. The majority of the boxes were lighter in weight than ours. But I don't think they would be practical here as our dogs are heavier and more varied in type of breed than I saw running at this competition.

We enjoyed our visit and the hospitality shown to us by the Warrington Wires Team and the other flyball teams. Unfortunately just prior to our visit, one of the young Warrington Wires dogs, Lucy had died. In our correspondence with them prior to our visit we had been telling them how we had a trophy that was presented to the flyball club with the team's highest percentage of wins at the National Flyball Titles and at the Melbourne Royal Show. They thought that this was a good idea and decided to do the same thing and named it after Lucy.

June presented the Lucy Locket Trophy at the end of the competition to Thors Rovers, a relative new team 2 years old from the Wirral peninsular just to the west of Warrington. It was a very well run competition by the Warrington Wires team, who did a very good job of running two rings
