Rule and Policy Notification 2023/2

At its meeting on 5 June 2023 the AFA committee approved the following:

- 1. A revision of the Black Card Penalty Protocol for black cards to simplify the awarding of a penalty and give the Dog Incident Sun-Committee flexibility in determining any penalty.
- 2. A revision to the Timekeepers Manual to reflect approving a financial contribution to assist trainee timekeepers from jurisdictions with few clubs to travel interstate to meet the requirements to become a timekeeper.
- 3. The deletion of the Training Day Policy and redefining a training day.

RULE CLARIFICATION – A revision to the Black Card Penalty Protocol to simplify its application and give flexibility to the Dog Incident Sub-Committee to award any penalty if required.

Appendix 14:

The current paragraph

If the *dog incident sub-committee* finds an allegation of *aggression* to be made out, the *dog incident sub-committee* will recommend a penalty in accordance with the AFA Black Card Penalty Protocol in Error! Reference source not found. is replaced with:

If the *dog incident sub-committee* finds an allegation of *aggression* to be made out, the *dog incident sub-committee* will have regard to the AFA Black Card Penalty Protocol in Table A14.1 in deciding on the appropriate penalty to be recommended. To avoid doubt, the *dog incident sub-committee* may recommend a penalty which is not consistent with the AFA Black Card Protocol where it considers that to be warranted in the circumstances.

The definition below is altered for consistency:

dog behaviour_incident_sub-committee means a sub-committee appointed by the AFA committee comprising three members of the AFA committee best qualified to assess dog behaviour. See Appendix 14.

The revised Black Card Penalty Protocol is adopted to replace existing protocol.

The Black Card Penalty Protocol clarification is effective from 1 August 2023.

MANAUL AMENDMENT – Timekeepers Manual amended

The AFA Committee has reviewed the reimbursement of expenses for trainee timekeepers and has approved the following amendment in the Time Keepers Manual.

Note: IfFor a timekeepers residesing in a jurisdictions where race meetings normally have fewer than 30 races, the AFA committee in its absolute discretion may agree, on receiving a request made in advance by the timekeeper, consider to pay or contribute to the expenses of the timekeeper in funding attendingance at a remote race meeting for the final required assignment of 30 races or for the opportunity to gain experience with different forms of racing at a race meeting.

The Manual amendment is effective from 1 August 2023.

POLICY - Training Day Policy

Due to issues with insurance coverage the Committee has approved the deletion of the Training Day Policy.

As a result of this change the following definition for training days has been updated in the Rules:

training day means an event held for the purpose of providing the opportunity for AFA members and dogs with a valid CRN to train in conditions similar to those normally found at race meetings.

The Training Day Policy is no longer valid from 1 July 2023 and the definition is effective from 1 August 2023.

At its meeting on 7 July 2023 the AFA committee approved a revision to the 90 Day Rule to remove any ambiguity in relation to how the AFA Committee applies the 90 Day Rule.

RULE CLARIFICATION – A revision to the 90 Day Rule to remove any ambiguity in relation to how the AFA Committee applies the 90 Day Rule.

Definition of owner

Change to read:

owner means the AFA member recorded in the AFA database as the owner of a dog.

Rule 2.5

Change first paragraph to read:

AFA recognises three classes of racing:

- regular class in which each team must be comprised of dogs that are all registered on the AFA database on the day of the race meeting as belonging to the same club;
- *open class* in which *teams* may comprise:
 - o dogs that are all registered on the **AFA** database as belonging to the same **club**; or
 - a combination of dogs that are registered on the AFA database as belonging to different clubs or no club;
- *veterans class* in which *teams* may comprise:
 - dogs that are all registered on the AFA database as belonging to the same club; or
 - a combination of dogs that are registered on the AFA database as belonging to different clubs or no club;

but all dogs must be at least seven years old on the date of the relevant race meeting.

Insert Rule 5.2A – Registration of dogs and changing clubs

The **owner** of a dog must register the dog on the **AFA** database as belonging to:

- a single specified *club*; or
- no *club*.

The *owner* of a dog may change the registration of the dog by giving notice to the *AFA committee*.

Rule 5.4

Change heading to Restriction on dogs racing with different clubs

Change the following paragraph:

<u>If aA</u> dog <u>hasthat</u> race<u>d</u>s in regular class in a team from one club <u>the **dog**</u> may not race in regular class in a team from another club for a period of 90 days <u>after the date on which it raced with the first **club**.</u>

The 90 Day Rule clarification is effective from 1 August 2023.
