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# **OFFICIALS POLICY**

# **Purpose**

The **AFA committee** acknowledges that **officials** are essential to the conduct of **flyball events** and is grateful to those **AFA members** who willingly volunteer their time and talents to assist in officiating. The **AFA committee** also acknowledges that it is in the best interest of the sport of flyball and all participants that there is a high standard of officiating and that **officials** are consistent in decision making.

The purpose of this policy is to supplement the *rules* so far as they relate to *officials* by clarifying requirements for *AFA members* to hold, and retain, qualification as *officials*.

# **Definitions and Interpretation**

In this policy:

- words and expressions defined in the *rules* have the same meaning where used in this policy;
- the principles of interpretation contained in the *rules* apply.

# **Stewards**

### General

There is no requirement for an adult **AFA member** to be a **registered steward** to be able to steward at a **race meeting**.

A *junior member* must be a *registered steward* to be able to steward and, dependent on age and whether acting as a *line steward* or a *box steward*, must be supervised by an adult *AFA member* who should be a registered steward (see rule 7.6).

Information for all **stewards** is contained in the Stewards Guidelines [link here]. The Guidelines identify what **stewards** should watch for and give examples to illustrate practical application of **rules**. The **AFA committee** strongly recommends that all **AFA members** should read the Guidelines as doing so will assist them in understanding **rules** of racing.

# Registration

An **AFA member** can become a **registered steward** by successfully completing the relevant knowledge assessment [link here] (see rule 7.4). There is no requirement for an **AFA member** to be approved by the **AFA committee** before completing the questionnaire. Completed questionnaires must be submitted to the **supervisory judge** who will advise the **AFA committee** if the **AFA member** is successful and qualifies as a **registered steward**.

Points are awarded towards the club of the year title for each *registered steward* in a *club* (see rules Appendix 16).

# Currency

There are no written or practical requirements to maintain registration as a **steward**.

# **Timekeepers**

### General

There are three levels of registration for *timekeepers*, namely, provisional, normal and senior.

There is no requirement for an adult **AFA member** to be a **registered timekeeper** to be able to time keep at a **race meeting**.

A **junior member** may time keep at a **race meeting**:

- from the age of 16; and
- only if they are a registered timekeeper and are supervised by a registered timekeeper (rule 7.6).

In a *sanction application* for a *race meeting* a *host club* must nominate at least two *timekeepers*. Unless the *AFA committee* agrees, at least one of the nominees must be a normal level or senior level *registered timekeeper*.

Example: If the **race meeting** is being held in a State or Territory in which there are no resident normal level or senior level **registered timekeepers** or where the **host club** demonstrates that no resident normal level or senior level **registered timekeeper** is available the **AFA committee** may agree that a suitably experienced **AFA member** be nominated in place of a normal level or senior level **registered timekeeper**.

The *race meeting organiser* may replace a *timekeeper* nominated in a *sanction application* with another *timekeeper* approved by an officiating *judge* or *AFA representative*.

Points are awarded towards the club of the year title for each *registered timekeeper* in a *club* (see rules Appendix 16).

The **AFA committee** maintains a list of current **registered timekeepers** [link here].

Information for *timekeepers* is contained in the Timekeepers Manual [<u>link here</u>] and the EJS Lights User Manual [<u>link here</u>].

### Registration

# **Provisional**

An **AFA member** who is a **registered steward** may become a provisional level **registered timekeeper** by successfully completing the knowledge and practical assessment [link for knowledge assessment and skill assessment]. Completed assessments must be submitted to the **supervisory judge** who will advise the **AFA committee** if the **AFA member** is successful and qualifies as a provisional level **registered timekeeper**.

#### Normal

A provisional level *registered timekeeper* is able to progress to normal level *registered timekeeper* by:

- completing the supervised practical training assignments specified in the Timekeepers Manual;
- obtaining a report signed off by a *judge* or a senior level *registered timekeeper* for each practical assignment [link here];
- achieving satisfactory performance as determined by the supervisory judge.

The *supervisory judge* will advise the *AFA committee* when a provisional level *registered timekeeper* has successfully fulfilled these requirements and so qualifies as a normal level *registered timekeeper*.

### Senior

The **AFA committee** may approve a normal level **registered timekeeper** progressing to senior level **registered timekeeper** when the **supervisory judge** recommends to the **AFA committee** that the normal level **registered timekeeper** is competent to mentor, supervise and report on provisional level **registered timekeepers** carrying out practical assignments.

### Currency

If a provisional level *registered timekeeper* does not complete the practical requirements to progress to normal level *registered timekeeper* within two years after successfully completing the knowledge and skills assessment the *AFA committee* may:

- if it is satisfied that the provisional level registered timekeeper has reasonable cause for not completing the practical requirements within that period, require the provisional level registered timekeeper to take and successfully complete a new knowledge and skills assessment and allow the provisional level registered timekeeper an additional period to complete the practical requirements; or
- if it is not satisfied that the provisional level *registered timekeeper* has reasonable cause for not completing the practical requirements within that time period, cancel the registration of the provisional level *registered timekeeper*.

The **AFA committee** may cancel the registration of a normal level or senior level **registered timekeeper** who, without reasonable cause, does not complete at least two time keeping assignments together totalling least 60 races over any rolling two year period.

*Example:* A provisional level *registered timekeeper* is resident in a State or Territory where there are insufficient *race meetings* for the provisional level *registered timekeeper* to complete the practical requirements over the relevant two year period would have reasonable cause for not completing the practical requirements within that time period.

**Registered timekeepers** are expected to be familiar with any **rule** changes or interpretations affecting their role and any changes or updates to the EJS.

The *AFA committee* may review the competency and performance of any *registered timekeeper* by requiring them to complete a refresher knowledge and skills assessment and one or more supervised time keeping assignments. However a *registered timekeeper* may only be reviewed once in any rolling three year period. A *registered timekeeper* who, on review, is found not to meet the required standard will be given a reasonable time to address identified issues, failing which the *AFA committee* may cancel their registration.

# **Judges**

### General

There are three levels of accreditation for *judges*, namely, provisional, Level 2, and Level 1 and two appointments for specific roles, namely, judge mentor and *supervisory judge*.

In a sanction application for a race meeting a host club must nominate one or more judges to officiate (rule 7.2). The AFA committee recommends that at least one nominated judge for every race meeting is a Level 1 judge, a judge mentor or the supervisory judge. The AFA committee will not approve a sanction application in which a provisional judge is nominated unless a Level 1 judge, a judge mentor or the supervisory judge is also nominated.

The *race meeting organiser* may replace a *judge* nominated in a *sanction application* with another *judge* after consultation with the *AFA representative* (rule 7.2).

The AFA committee maintains a list of current judges [link here].

An **AFA member** who wishes to become a **judge** must be approved by the **AFA committee** and successfully complete the training program for **judges** (rule 7.2).

Information for *judges* and prospective *judges* is contained in the Judges Accreditation Process booklet [<u>link here</u>], the Provisional Judge Capabilities Booklet [<u>link here</u>], Level 2 and Level 1 Judge Capabilities booklet [<u>link here</u>] and the Judges Manual [<u>link here</u>].

Points are awarded towards the club of the year title for each accredited *judge* in a *club* (see rules Appendix 16).

### Accreditation

### **Provisional**

An **AFA member** who wishes to be approved by the **AFA committee** to commence the training program for **judges** must submit a completed application form [link here] to the **AFA secretary**.

To be approved the applicant must:

- be at least 18 years of age;
- be an **AFA member** in good standing for at least 12 months, with no record of disciplinary action, probation or suspension for;
- be a normal or senior *registered timekeeper*;
- demonstrate the qualities of a *judge* having regard to the requirements of the role as set out in the *rules* and the Judges Manual.

Once an applicant is approved the *supervisory judge* will provide the applicant with the assessment for provisional *judges*. The *supervisory judge* will advise the *AFA committee* when the applicant has successfully completed the knowledge and skills assessment and so qualifies for accreditation as a provisional *judge*.

### Level 2

A provisional *judge* may apply for promotion to Level 2 *judge* after:

- completing at least five judging assignments at least one of which must be supervised by the
   supervisory judge with the others supervised by a judge mentor, the supervisory judge or a Level 1
   judge approved by the supervisory judge;
- achieving a rating of at least "4" across all the provisional *judge* capabilities from a judge mentor, the *supervisory judge* or a Level 1 *judge* approved by the *supervisory judge*.

The *supervisory judge* will advise the *AFA committee* when the provisional *judge* has successfully completed these requirements and so qualifies for accreditation as a Level 2 *judge*.

### Level 1

A Level 2 *judge* may apply for promotion to Level 1 *judge* after attaining the following criteria in the order listed:

- 1. completing at least twenty-five assignments as a Level 2 *judge*;
- 2. achieving a rating of at least "4" across all the Level 2 *judge* capabilities from a judge mentor, the *supervisory judge* or a Level 1 *judge* approved by the *supervisory judge*;
- 3. successfully completing the assessment for a Level 1 *judge*.

The *supervisory judge* will advise the *AFA committee* when the Level 2 *judge* has successfully completed these requirements and so qualifies as a Level 1 *judge*.

### **Appointments**

### **Judge Mentor**

The *AFA committee* may periodically call for expressions of interest from Level 1 *judges* who wish to be appointed as judge mentors.

An applicant for appointment as judge mentor must have achieved all Level 1 *judge* capabilities and demonstrate the additional capabilities required of a judge mentor specified in the Judges Accreditation Process booklet.

An appointment as judge mentor will be for such term as the **AFA committee** decides but not more than three years. A person appointed as a judge mentor may apply to be reappointed following expiry of their appointment.

# **Supervisory Judge**

The AFA committee must ensure that the position of supervisory judge is filled at all times.

At least three months before expiry of the appointment of each *supervisory judge* the *AFA committee* must call for expressions of interest from Level 1 *judges* who wish to be appointed as *supervisory judge*.

An applicant for appointment as *supervisory judge* must satisfy the criteria including the additional capabilities required of a *supervisory judge* specified in the Judges Accreditation Process booklet.

The appointment of a *supervisory judge* will be for a term of two years. A person appointed as *supervisory judge* may apply for reappointment at the end of their term.

### Currency

If a provisional *judge* does not complete the requirements for promotion to Level 2 *judge* within two years after qualifying as a provisional *judge* the *AFA committee* may:

- if it is satisfied that the provisional *judge* has reasonable cause for not completing the
  requirements within that period, require the provisional *judge* to take and successfully complete a
  new knowledge and skills assessment and allow the provisional *judge* an additional period to
  complete the requirements; or
- if it is not satisfied that the provisional **judge** has reasonable cause for not completing the practical requirements within that period, cancel the accreditation of the provisional **judge**.

The **AFA committee** may withdraw the accreditation of a Level 2 **judge** or a Level 1 **judge** who does not, without reasonable cause, complete at least two judging assignments in each calendar year.

Judges are expected to be familiar with any rule changes or interpretations.

The **AFA committee** may periodically (review the competency and performance of any **judge** by requiring them to complete a refresher knowledge and skills assessment and one or more supervised judging assignments. However a **judge** may only be reviewed once in any rolling three year period. A **judge** who, on review, fails to meet the required standard will be given a reasonable time to address any identified issues, failing which the **AFA committee** may withdraw the **judge's** accreditation.

# **AFA Representative**

### General

In a *sanction application* for a *race meeting* a *host club* must nominate an *AFA representative* who must be:

- a current member of the AFA committee;
- a judge not officiating at the event;
- a registered AFA representative.

An **AFA member** who wishes to become a **registered AFA representative** must be approved by the **AFA committee** and successfully complete the relevant questionnaire (see rule 7.5).

The **AFA committee** maintains a list of current **registered AFA representatives** [link here].

Points are awarded towards the club of the year title for each *registered AFA representative* in a *club* (see rules Appendix 16).

### Registration

An **AFA member** who wishes to be approved by the **AFA committee** must submit a completed application form [link here] to the **AFA secretary**.

To be approved the applicant must:

- be at least 18 years of age;
- be an **AFA member** in good standing for at least 12 months, with no record of disciplinary action, probation or suspension;
- demonstrate the qualities of an AFA representative having regard to the requirements of the role
  as set out in the rules.

Once an applicant is approved the *supervisory judge* will provide the applicant with the knowledge and skills assessment for *AFA representatives*. The *supervisory judge* will advise the *AFA committee* when the applicant has successfully completed the knowledge and skills assessment and so qualifies as a *registered AFA representative*.

### Currency

The **AFA committee** may cancel the registration of a **registered AFA representative** who, without reasonable cause, does not act as AFA representative for at least three **race meetings** in any rolling two year period.

**Registered AFA representatives** are expected to be familiar with any **rule** changes or interpretations affecting their role.

The **AFA committee** may periodically review the competency of any **registered AFA representative** by requiring them to complete a refresher knowledge and skills assessment. However, a registered **AFA representative** may only be reviewed once in any rolling period of three years. If the **registered AFA representative** is not successful the AFA committee may cancel their registration.
